

## What is Medically Assisted Treatment?

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Medically Assisted Treatment (MAT) is the use of medications with counseling and behavioral therapies to treat substance use disorders and prevent opioid overdose. MAT is primarily used for the treatment of addiction to opioids such as heroin/fentanyl and prescription pain pills that contain opiates.

## What Medications are Available?

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Methadone, Suboxone, Subutex, Sublocade, (Buprenorphine), and Vivitrol (Naltrexone) are used to treat opioid addiction. Opioid addiction is a substance use disorder. It is not a moral weakness; it is a chronic disease called opioid use disorder (OUD). It changes and rewires the brain, making it hard for people to quit. MAT can be safely prescribed for individuals with OUD to assist them in their treatment needs.

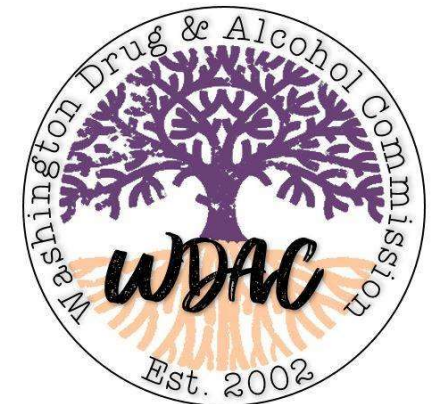
